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APG Members Impacted By SoCal Wildfires

APG's CMO, Dr. Susan Huang, reports the following information. The Pacific Palisades and Eaton fires combined have burned over 40,000 acres over the past 2 weeks in Southern California. The scale and speed of these and multiple other wildfires in Los Angeles County are unprecedented and have resulted in significant impacts on APG's Southern California member organizations, their staff, and patients in the region.

- Clinics destroyed
- Offices closed and medical centers prepared to evacuate
- Disaster command centers and response plans reactivated/implemented with proactive patient outreach and increased use of telehealth for care access and continuity
- Organizations and staff navigated intermittent loss of internet access, power, water, and poor air quality; some now mitigating and managing smoke damage
- Many clinicians, clinical staff, and care workforce directly impacted by evacuations, loss of homes, and displaced families
- Large populations of patients displaced or affected

There are untold numbers of patients affected in the region. UCLA and SoCal Kaiser Permanente both estimate thousands to tens of thousands of patients affected directly by the fires or by evacuations. While health care professionals across the region have prioritized continuing to work and care for their patients, many suffered direct and personal losses in the fires. UCLA, Cedars-Sinai, Providence, SoCal Permanente Medical Group, AltaMed, Astrana Health, and others have had hundreds of physicians and staff who have lost homes, suffered major damage to homes, were evacuated or displaced.

One of AltaMed Health Services' primary care clinic sites in Pasadena was destroyed in the Eaton fire, and several of their other Pasadena clinic sites remain temporarily closed. Providence Southern California's Saint John's Physician Partners site was completely lost in the Pacific Palisades fire. UCLA Health's Family Medicine clinic in Pacific Palisades was also destroyed along with several of its community clinics temporarily closed due to power outages and proximity to evacuation zones. The Eaton fire threatened direct destruction of Astrana Health's headquarter locations and affected its operations with significant electricity, internet, and other utility outages. Several of Astrana's primary care and specialty care sites have also had to close temporarily. Cedars-Sinai is managing smoke damage to several of its clinical sites; all patients of temporarily closed sites have been cared for virtually or at alternative locations. Providence offices in Santa Monica closed temporarily, and its Saint John's Medical Center prepared to evacuate though did not have to do so in the end. Providence's clinical operations have otherwise resumed. Southern California Kaiser reactivated its disaster command center and had several sites temporarily closed. During the height of the fires, several major medical centers postponed elective surgeries, though most are now back to full operations.

To support relief responses, Astrana Health set up a volunteer day program and a charity matching program. AltaMed established the 2025 <u>Fire Relief Fund</u> to support relief efforts for impacted patients, employees, and communities. Cedars-Sinai's <u>donation site</u> is providing support to their staff and physicians. California Governor's Office of Emergency Services has also set up a <u>CA donations site</u>.

Several APG member leaders noted significant need for ongoing/long term management of environmental exposures, trauma, and mental health, in parallel with community rebuilding challenges, given the degree of utilities, business, and community infrastructure losses.
